Ending Violence Against Women and Minorities

In collaboration with the Gaston Regional Branch. We'll hear about the proposed NC Hate Crimes Bill, State, and local Domestic Violence issues. Every 9 seconds in the US, a woman is assaulted or beaten; 1 in 5 college women (22%) report physical abuse, sexual abuse, or threats.
